## New On Argo

The City staff has provided an update on the project. For those of you wondering when construction will start, here's the story:

The permit for the project was submitted to the State on March 7<sup>th</sup> and is under review. The State has 90 days to complete the review and approve the project. At the same time, a project team consisting of City staff and the design/construction team are meeting every two weeks to monitor progress. At the last meeting of this team, a tentative schedule was discussed that would have construction start in June, with much of the project completed by late October. Because of the location of the construction, DTE has granted permission to the contractor to stage on and gain access through the MichCon site.

I keep hoping to take photos of the construction.

Further news is that the VA and City staff are meeting soon to continue discussions about Hydroelectric generation at City dams. You may remember that the VA was awaiting permission from Washington for those talks to continue -- that permission has been granted.

Hydroelectric generation is actually exciting news for this area, and I'm looking forward to hearing more about that project.
