# Survey on Single Stream Recycling and Recycle Bank

**The issue:** The City Council agreed to reconsider a vote on whether or not to provide an additional \$107,000 to Recycle Ann Arbor. That vote is supposed to take place on **Thursday, August 4**.

City staff members have been answering questions about Recycle Bank and Recycle Ann Arbor's budget and about the success of single stream recycling. Some things seems clear to me:

- 1. The City is receiving more recyclables due to a combination of Single Stream and new contracts with other municipalities, who bring their recyclables here to our Materials Recovery Facility (MRF).
- 2. Many people don't use RecycleBank coupons.
- 3. The link between RecycleBank and any increase in recycling isn't clear.

I'd like to learn what your experiences are with recycling in Ann Arbor. Here's a very quick survey:


